10. In 2016, National FFA Alumni membership jumps to 225,891 from 62,705 in 2015.

12. To be eligible to receive the Chapter FFA Degree from the chapter, a member must have participated in the planning and conducting of at least three official functions in the chapter's Program of Activities.

16. The subsidiary motion to lay on the table can be reconsidered.
17. The incidental motion to withdraw/ modify a motion is not debatable.
18. It is suggested that the study of parliamentary procedure should begin with the table of motions, spending only enough time on each motion for students to obtain a “working” knowledge of principles involved.
19. There are eight characteristics of an effective leader that a presiding officer should possess, including “fair and impartial judgement.”
20. Presenters of debatable motions should always give brief explanatory remarks before they present their motion.
21. If the question is debatable, the president states, “The question is now open for debate.” or, the president may ask, “Are there any remarks?” or “Is there any debate?”
22. Unless otherwise specified by rule, any one speech by a member may not exceed five minutes in length.
23. The motion, which brings an item to the assembly, to discharge a committee does not require a second and is debatable.
24. When the president requests action by general consent and there is an objection, even by just one member, a vote must then be taken to determine the outcome.
25. A motion that is temporarily delayed should be brought back before the assembly as soon as possible.
26. An amendment applying to an original motion is of the first rank and an amendment to an amendment is of the second rank.
27. If a member rises to a point of order and does not agree with the decision rendered (chair’s ruling), the member may appeal from the chair’s decision.

28. The motion to close nominations requires a second, is undebatable, and unamendable.

29. The motion “Postponing to a certain time (definitely)” may be postponed until, but not beyond, the next regular business session. It is not proper to postpone a question to a time between meetings, without having first made provision for an adjourned meeting.

30. When the president leaves the chair for the purpose of debating an item of business, the president should ask the vice president, or some other officer if the vice president is absent, to preside.

31. The 2020-2021 State President and First Vice President were elected by voting delegates across the state through an on online election platform

32. The Texas FFA Alumni Benefit Auction and the Collegiate FFA convention are held during the Texas FFA Convention.

33. For the state FFA delegation body, a majority of chapter members which are registered for convention constitutes a quorum.

34. The state’s 12-member officer team serves as part of the 75-member delegation and the area associations are given the opportunity to select members to travel to the national convention to represent the interests of the state’s members in conducting the National FFA Organization’s business.

35. The chapter membership should reflect the demographic profile of the community, and if not, the local chapter should be engaged in tactics to reach this standard.

36. Each of the area associations have the opportunity to nominate for the Honorary Lone Star FFA Degree a number of worthy non-teacher recipients not to exceed ten percent of the number of regular membership from the previous year.

37. FFA dues are paid annually, and the membership year begins August 1st and expires on July 31st.

38. Don Beene of Fairfield served as the Executive Secretary of the Young Farmers of Texas for 14 years and retired in January 2018.

39. The Agriculture Teachers Association of Texas was established to promote and advance agricultural education in Texas and provide legal representation to safeguard agriculture teachers and agricultural education programs.

40. The Texas FFA Foundation website houses the My Texas FFA website.

41. During the Tractor Technician CDE team members appraise components and parts of tractors and agricultural implements and make recommendations for services needed and not needed, complete a written exam and finally the team of three - five members, working as a group, compete in locating and correcting five deliberately placed malfunctions in diesel fueled tractors and safely navigate the repaired tractor through a driving course within the 25-minute time limit.

42. The Extemporaneous Public Speaking contestants are given 30 minutes to prepare a speech on one of three randomly selected agricultural and natural resources topic. After delivering the speech, contestants are asked questions about their speech and topic.

43. Junior Prepared Public Speaking participants advance from district to area to state in their respective division and then six division champions are chosen in the semifinal round at the state FFA convention in July and an overall champion is selected in the final round. The overall state winner advances to the national competition that is held, during the National FFA Convention in late October.

44. Course credits received through credit by examination shall not count towards satisfying the six different semesters of instruction.

45. Leadership Development Events have been held continuously by SHSU since then, with the exception of a six-year interruption created by World War II.

46. More than 15 million individual and family forest landowners own 42% of total forest land in the United States, representing a diverse group of people who have many reasons for owning their forest land

47. In Texas greenhouse and nursery commodities are ranked fifth in terms of cash receipts with a value of \$1.3 billion.

48. Forage grasses produced for seed include in part, Bermuda Sprigs, Buffleggrass, Gammagrasses, Sorghum-Sudan Grass, and Pearl Millet.

49. 4,200 acres of Rye is planted for seed production with 3000 acres certified for seed resale.

50. Alfalfa is a highly palatable legume that has been grown as livestock feed since the fourth century.
